- a. <u>Constitution Capital Partners Ironsides</u>: Chair Lutton reviewed possible allocation of funds to CCPI Fund VI in the amount of \$25,000,000.00. Upon motion by Trustee Lutton and second by Trustee Sanchez, the investment in CCPIF was unanimously approved (split equally between Fund of Fund and (coinvestment). He also discussed due diligence site visit to Ocean Avenue (private equity).
- 2. Personnel/ Audit: None.

3. Benefits:

- a. <u>Diabetic Program</u>: Welldyne reported on pilot program (4 months) to identity and address members with diabetes. Education is primary outreach with nutritional and exercise programs. Programs also monitored changes in Drug Therapy, 1/3 of which intervention was initiated. Substantial savings with no impact on care were identified. Recommendation is to extend program to larger pool of members. ROI is projected at 2 to 1, which is guaranteed if engaged. Board will consider extension of program at later meeting.
- b. <u>Member Appeal</u>: Member challenged coverage for surgery post-mastectomy for breast reconstruction. No action taken.
- c. USI Pharmacy Consultant: No action taken.
